Carbon Calculator

Most of us now know that as good stewards of God's creation, it's crucial that we reduce our carbon emissions. Flying, driving, keeping our homes warm, and even eating produces harmful carbon emissions. As committed as we might be to treading lightly, there are always some emissions that can't be avoided.

However, we can choose to help compensate for our impact by giving to support projects around the world that improve people's lives and reduce carbon emissions. While all BMS

World Mission supported projects are assessed for their environmental impact, some have the [Climate Stewards](#) 'Seal of Approval' which means they generate quantifiable carbon emission reductions to help mitigate climate change.

When you give to BMS you are supporting these projects across the world, such as providing solar panels at Guinebor II Hospital in Chad, or planting trees in northern Uganda.

How much to give

It's up to you to decide how much of your household carbon budget to help compensate for. To keep things simple, choose a pre-set option which makes sense for your household.

If you spend £10 per week on pet food, £15 could help compensate for your pet's dinners for a year.

If you drive 3,000 miles per year in a medium sized car, you could give £27 to help compensate for your annual emissions.

£227 could help compensate for annual food consumption for a family of four.

£44 could help compensate for returns flights from London to Rome for a family of four.

£80 could help compensate for the average household's use of gas and electricity for a year.
