William Tyndale

Do you like the Tudors? It's a favourite period in English history for a lot of people – and in William Tyndale, it gave us a kind of one-man proto-Bible Society.

This year marks the half-millennium since Tyndale's English translation of the New Testament was published.

Tyndale was a background radical during Henry VIII's reign (he's mentioned in *Wolf Hall* but doesn't get involved in the action). As a young Catholic priest in England he was inspired by Martin Luther's groundbreaking translation of the Bible into German, and he went to work doing the same for English speakers.

If you've read the Authorised Version of the Bible, or even an update of it (the RSV, ASV or ESV), you've experienced Tyndale's phrases. His work has survived multiple revisions across centuries. It even gave us the title of a Prince album, with Tyndale's Matthew 16.3, 'can ye not discern ye signes of the tymes', becoming Prince's classic *Sign o' the Times* in 5321
