Slough Baptist Church is looking to appoint a new member of staff to join its friendly team.

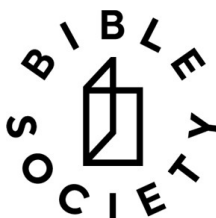
Church Cleaner/Caretaker 26 hours per week - permanent

Monday (17 August) was the birthday of William Carey, the first BMS mission worker, often regarded as the “Father of Modern Missions”. It’s his legacy and the legacy of those first Baptists who came together to form The Baptist Missionary Society (now BMS World Mission) to send him in 1792 that we strive to still faithfully carry today. Their legacy is not just an example to follow or a set of values to keep – although it is those too! – but a steady chain of people who hand the work one to another, over decades that become centuries.

Krishna Bahadur Bohora who is Project Co-ordinator for Kathmandu International Study Centre’s Educational Quality Improvement Programme (KISC EQUIP for short), which provides teacher training across Nepal. His letter shared his reflections on his recent visit to the UK with his colleague Dil.

In Dumfries, they reconnected with Joy [Ransome], who previously served with them in Nepal. In Perth, Lancaster and Fife, they met many people who had visited or served in Nepal years ago. And then they shared a precious reunion in Kendal connecting with KISC EQUIP’s former principal and faithful friends who helped lay the foundations of KISC EQUIP. That was the most profound moment for Krishna.

“It happened when I sat with those connected to the very roots of KISC EQUIP,” says Krishna. “They spoke of an ‘impossible’ beginning – of how God moved when the doors were bolted shut, and how visionaries sacrificed everything to see the gospel take root in the mountains. Standing there, I felt a humble weight. I realised we are not starting from scratch; we are picking up a torch that has been burning for a long time. It is a light, glorious burden. We are standing on the shoulders of giants who trusted God in the dark. To be part of an organisation built on such a legacy of sacrifice is a grace I do not take lightly. It is our turn now to carry that flame forward with the same steady courage.”

Krishna and Dil are our current link missionaries and Joy Ransome our previous one.
